Bob Majerus Director/Vice Treasurer Construction time as arrived and the restoration of the Monarch Great Northern Railroad Depot will continue. Fund raising will continue for the Neihart Fire Alarm Bell Tower.

**Historic Great Northern Depot Restoration.** Remaining projects include: interior and exterior trim around windows, bead board removed for repairs to the walls and electrical wiring will be nailed back in place in the waiting room and living quarters for the station master, office walls will get bead board, wood flooring laid, a window over the east freight door replaced, and pockets for the freight doors built. Exterior stairs to the boarding platform need handrails and the handicap ramp will be built.

**Neihart Fire Alarm Bell Tower.** Fund raising continues to erect a tower for Neihart's 450 pound fire alarm bell. Purchased in 1894 to replace an inadequate bell in use, the original 30 foot wood tower stood until 1945. To date, 36% of the \$20,000 cost has been raised. MNHG hopes to get the base of the tower constructed this summer. Donations for this project can be made to MNHG, P.O. Box 924, Monarch, MT 59463. **National Register of Historic Places.** The MNHG Board of Directors is working with the City County Historic Preservation Officer and the Montana State Preservation Office on the Monarch Depot application for a listing in the National Register. Updates on the application will be offered in the fall newsletter.

#### From the Neihart Herald:

July 31, 1891. "Fred McGibbon was prospecting last Saturday near the miners' cemetery and had sat down to eat lunch. Two small cub bears came out of the brush, and attracted his attention by whining and growling. He seized his pick and struck at one of them but missed it; at this the young bear set up a cry which called the old bear out of the brush who at once started for Mr. McGibbon as if to foreclose a mortgage on this life. Mr. McGibbon ran as if he wished to live a few days longer, and yelling at the top of his voice so frightened the bear that she chased him only a short distance. His brother Chas. McGibbon came up shortly with a team and discovered Fred crawling with a sprained ankle and almost frightened to death. On his approach the bear fled." The Neihart herald.
