**School Tour.** The K-12 Geyser school district toured the Depot and Drover Car May 5<sup>th</sup>. It was fun having the students who received a history lesson of mining and railroad in Monarch and Neihart in the early 20<sup>th</sup> Century. After exploring the Depot Historic District, they devoured their sack lunches on the boarding platform. After lunch, they were bused up Dry Fork Creek to the Hughesville area where they collected water samples for their environmental studies.

<u>Grant Received.</u> MNHG applied for and received a grant from the **Big Sky Country National Heritage Area** for \$1000 for the construction of the **Neihart Fire Alarm Bell Tower**. Construction of the tower has begun and the completed structure will be placed this summer. The tower is coated steel which is expected to last many years and the coating will prevent rust. The tower will be 28 feet tall with the bell residing at 20 feet. The Town of Neihart purchased the bell in 1895 after it was determined the bell in use was inadequate. A wooden tower was built which stood until 1945 when it was razed due to rot at the bottom. The bell has been in storage except for a brief time in the 1960s when it was displayed on a short tower. The steel tower design is based on an 1895 photo of the original tower.

**From the** *Neihart Herald, January 21, 1893:* "We should never overlook even in one small particular (sic) the great supremacy of this town over others in the county. We have here a prize fighter, who can lick any man of 175 pounds weight in or around this county. He lately thumped the best man White Sulphur Springs could put up and didn't know he had been in a fight. We do not say this boastingly but will back it up with collateral evidence if necessary." *The Neihart herald.
